We are very pleased to announce that the GfV has commissioned Verbandplus+ in Aschaffenburg **to implement a GfV office**. This office will serve as a permanent contact point and takes care of the administrative affairs of the GfV starting on January, 1st 2023.

We hope that this centralized GfV office will facilitate the work of the Executive Board and secure continuity beyond changes of the management board.

We are also very pleased and grateful to the <u>Chica and Heinz Schaller</u> <u>foundation</u>, which supports the GfV to enable the implementation of a part-time position for a scientist, who will take care of scientific affairs related to the GfV.
